Update on EU Negotiations

Round Two of negotiations began on Monday 20 April by videoconference and lasted until Friday. They included further constructive talks with the aim of making progress ahead of June, building on the talks to date which have identified the major areas where we agree and disagree.

NEW – **The Coronavirus Job Retention Scheme** opened for applications on 20 April. Employers can now claim online for a grant for 80% of their furloughed employees' salaries, up to a maximum of £2,500 per employee. Please <u>click here to make a claim</u>.

HMRC have produced this <u>step by step guidance</u> on how to make a claim. There is also a <u>calculator</u> to help you work out your claim.

The Chancellor has also announced one <u>month extension</u> to the scheme. This means that the scheme will be open until the end of June, to reflect continuing lockdown measures.

NEW – The Chancellor announced a new £1.25 billion government support package to help UK businesses driving innovation and development through the COVID-19 outbreak. The comprehensive package includes a new £500 million loan scheme for high-growth firms, called the Future Fund, and £750 million of targeted support for small and medium sized businesses focusing on research and development.
