UKHSA announced as first PACE collaboration to help tackle deadly antimicrobial resistance

PACE (Pathways to Antimicrobial Clinical Efficacy) has announced a partnership with the UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) to support innovators developing new antimicrobials.

PACE was founded in 2023 by LifeArc, Medicines Discovery Catapult, and Innovate UK, with a £30 million programme of funding and support to be deployed over five years. PACE is focused on removing barriers and connecting the antimicrobial resistance (AMR) research and development (R&D) ecosystem to accelerate and strengthen the pre-clinical pipeline. Its first funding call was launched in October 2023 with up to £10 million available to support innovators developing new treatments for the most threatening microbes and resistance mechanisms.

AMPLY Discovery raises £1.4m in Innovate UK grant funding to tackle complex diseases

Belfast-based techbio company AMPLY Discovery Limited has raised over £1.4m in grant funding to develop new drug products using its proprietary AI-driven drug discovery platform.

The company is currently focused on two flagship R&D programmes which will provide technical validation for its development platform. The first programme, focused on RNAi therapies to tackle highly genetically mediated cancers, has been awarded £835,000 by Innovate UK and Innosuisse to develop a new RNAi therapy for Acute Myeloid Leukaemia.

The second programme, focused on inhaled antimicrobial therapies to fight multi-drug resistant (MDR) lung infections, has been awarded £602,000 by Innovate UK to develop a new nebulised antimicrobial product for MDR-TB.

The demand for RNA-based technology has boomed since the success of COVID-19 vaccines in saving lives and preventing serious illness. RNA-based therapeutics have many more potential applications: in other vaccines, in cancer treatments, and in personalised medicines, such as gene therapies and protein replacement.

Biotech start-up BugBiome secures investment for pioneering research in sustainable pest protection

BugBiome, a biotech harnessing nature's microbial defences for pest protection to benefit human and planet health, has successfully closed a pre-seed funding round, securing £310k from Cambridge Angels and Discovery Park Ventures.

This investment will support BugBiome's mission to address agricultural and human pest protection with naturally derived solutions harnessing the microbiome as a sustainable source of alternatives to synthetic and bioaccumulative chemicals. It also provides matched funding for a £330k Engineering Biology Grant from Innovate UK, to identify new methods to control aphids in crop protection. The 12-month project aligns with BugBiome's focus for sustainable, insect control solutions that do not compromise biodiversity, including a pipeline of targets across human and agricultural pests.

PulmoBioMed, a UK-based university spin-out is developing a new lung test that could lead to earlier diagnosis of asthma, a condition which currently affects more than 27 million people in the US1 and kills 10 people, on average, every day.

The company is readying to launch PBM-Hale[™] into the US market following a successful investment round that raised £1.4m (\$1.75m) to commercialize the technology. The technology will be of interest to researchers, Contract

Research Organizations (CROs) and pharma companies seeking to identify and stratify patients with a range of lung conditions.

Life sciences: how can you prepare for UK GAAP changes?

In October 2023, the Financial Reporting Council (FRC) announced a delay to the publication and effective date of the future changes to UK GAAP from its periodic review.

The revised suite of standards reflecting the second periodic review of UK GAAP is now expected to be issued in the first half of 2024 and implemented not before periods commencing on or after 1 January 2026, instead of 1 January 2025 as originally planned.



Aleta Biotherapeutics and Cancer Research UK's Centre for Drug Development announce first patient dosed in ALETA-001 Phase 1/2 clinical trial in patients with relapsed/refractory B-cell malignancies

Aleta Biotherapeutics (Aleta), a clinical stage, immuno-oncology company with a CAR Tcell engager (CTE) platform that enables cell cancer therapies to work more effectively, and Cancer Research UK's Centre for Drug Development, announce the first patient was dosed in a Phase 1/2 clinical trial. This trial is evaluating the Company's first-in-class biologic CAR T-cell engager, ALETA-001, for the treatment of patients with B-cell malignancies who are relapsed/refractory to CD19-targeting CAR T-cell therapy.

Cancer Research UK's Centre for Drug Development is sponsoring and conducting the Phase 1/2 clinical trial of ALETA-001, the lead agent in Aleta's portfolio.

European Parliament seeks ban on patenting of gene-edited plants

European Parliament has supported proposals by the European Commission to relax the regulatory requirements for certain categories of plants produced by new genomic techniques (NGT) [1].

Currently in the EU, NGT plants are classified as Genetically Modified Organisms (GMOs), leading to some of the strictest regulatory requirements anywhere in the world. However, MEPs have voted for a simpler process for regulating categories of NGT plants which may contain modifications comparable to those obtained by conventional breeding. The stated objective for these changes is to make the food system more sustainable and resilient by facilitating the development of improved plant varieties.
