

2025 BioInfect Conference - Call for Posters

Submit your abstract for the 2025 BioInfect Conference Wednesday 5th February 2025 at The Spine, Liverpool

Abstract submission deadline: Friday 24th January 2025

Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) is one of the top global public health and development threats. According to a 2022 article published in the Lancet, it is estimated that bacterial AMR was directly responsible for 1.27 million global deaths in 2019 and contributed to 4.95 million deaths.

Antimicrobial resistance: a growing issue

The misuse and overuse of antimicrobials in humans, animals and plants are the main drivers in the development of drug-resistant pathogens.

Without effective tools for the prevention and adequate treatment of drug-resistant infections and improved access to existing and new quality-assured antimicrobials, the number of people for whom treatment is failing or who die of infections will increase. Medical procedures, such as routine surgery (including caesarean sections or hip replacements), cancer chemotherapy, and organ transplantation, will become more risky.

Call for posters

There is no better way to showcase new developments, ongoing research projects and speculative or innovative work in progress relating to the study of Antimicrobial Resistance.

Authors are invited to submit an abstract which is related to the area of Antimicrobial Resistance. The posters are intended to provide authors and participants with a greater understanding of the subject matter and to engage in discussions about the work.

Authors must submit an abstract of no more than 300 words in English outlining aims, objectives, methodology and conclusions. The poster must be prepared in A0 size (841 x 1189mm) in either portrait or landscape format.

Posters will be on display in the main conference hall and the poster boards will be provided for authors to display the posters.
