University of Liverpool launches digital bioresource to tackle rare eye cancers

The University of Liverpool has launched the Eye Cancer Artificial Intelligence Digital Bioresource (EYE-CAN-AID), an initiative to improve early detection of rare eye cancers.

The launch featured technology from Roche Diagnostics – a state-of-the-art, high-resolution scanner to analyse eye cancer cells and tissues. The VENTANA® DP 600 digital pathology slide scanner will play a vital role in providing high quality digital images of rare ocular (eye) tumours and their subsequent interpretation, ultimately benefiting patients by improving diagnosis and treatment pathways.

New research will examine the use of welfare reform to tackle health inequalities

As debate over changes to Britain's welfare system continues to dominate the news, members of a multidisciplinary team of researchers are beginning a two-year study to examine the case for transformative welfare policy and the impact on public health outcomes.

Led by public policy researchers at Northumbria University and funded by the National Institute for Health and Care Research (NIHR), the study brings together experts in economics, behavioural science, health history and epidemiology to carry out analysis of a growing body of research which suggests establishing a universal support system to provide people with more financial certainty could have a positive effect on mental and physical health, while saving the NHS money.

Continuous Biomanufacturing: An emerging technology for new biopharmaceutical modalities

Growing pharmaceutical modalities and emerging manufacturing technologies are key themes of Bionow's 2025 Pharma Manufacturing conference. This is a critical conversation in biomanufacturing because new biologics modalities such as bispecific and multi-specific antibodies, Fc-fusions, and antibody fragments presents several challenges which could restrict patients from accessing these innovative treatments.

These challenges derive from the inherent complexity of new modalities. To begin with, there are obstacles to the development of stable expression systems and upstream processes that give high productivity. Their structural complexity can lead to problems ensuring their correct assembly and stability. Further, the increased presence of product-related impurities, such as half antibodies and fragments, complicates purification processes and contribute further to yield losses.

Use it or Lose it: A reminder to the holders of Comparable Registrations

As a consequence of Brexit, owners of EU trade mark registrations (EUTM's, or European Union Trade Marks) were granted an equivalent 'Comparable' UK registration. This was to ensure that EU rights holders were not adversely affected as a consequence of Brexit.

Each of these Comparable Registrations:

- Were recorded on the UK Register and afforded the same legal status as if they had been applied for and registered under UK law.
- Kept the original filing date of the corresponding EUTM, with the same goods and services
- Kept the original priority/seniority dates of the corresponding EUTM.

Jetbio: Advancing 3D Bioprinting for Drug Discovery and Regenerative Medicine

In biotechnology, creating accurate in vitro models that mimic the human cellular environment is crucial for advancing drug discovery and development. Current 3D cell culture techniques, though promising, face limitations in achieving the high cell densities necessary for effective tissue modelling. Jetbio is a pioneering 3D bioprinting startup tackling these challenges directly. Their innovative approach promises to enhance the preclinical screening process, reduce dependency on animal testing, lower costs, and accelerate research timelines.

Jetbio is commercialising this groundbreaking bioprinting system called Reactive Jet Impingement (ReJI). ReJI merges the precision and speed of traditional drop-on-demand (DoD) bioprinting, a method that ejects bioink droplets only when needed, with the ability to achieve high physiological cell densities, essential for creating tissue-like structures.

The Life Sciences Innovative Manufacturing Fund (LSIMF) is a capital grants fund which aims to build resilience for future health emergencies and capitalise on the UK's world-leading research and development capabilities. The fund will enhance and accelerate affordable access to mature, new and emerging Life Sciences products for both pandemic and non-pandemic scenarios.

LSIMF will provide up to £520 million in capital grants for investment in the manufacture of human medicines and medical technology (including diagnostics, and MedTech products).

Applications will undergo assessment in quarterly rounds until all the funding has been allocated:

- Round 1 is closed
- Round 2 is closed
- Round 3 is open and will close on 30 May 2025
- Round 4 will open on 01 August 2025 and close on 29 August 2025
