Authors must submit an abstract of no more than 300 words in English outlining aims, objectives, methodology and conclusions. The poster must be prepared in A0 size (841 x 1189mm) in portrait format.

Approved posters will be on display at the conference venue and poster boards will be provided for authors to display their posters.
