Guardtech support staff member's epic trek for cancer charity close to the business' heart

The Gaurdtech Group have donated £500 to a dedicated Synovial Sarcoma Fund within Sarcoma UK – a charity that funds vital research into a rare cancer – as part of a fundraising walk by a much-loved member of their team.

IT & Systems Manager Elliott Sheppard lost his daughter Isobel to the disease three years ago and has since created a platform to raise awareness of Synovial Sarcoma called Isobel's Legacy.

Elliott took part in the 25km Thames Bridge Trek earlier this

month to raise vital funds and, at the last count, The Isobel Sheppard Legacy Fund had raised £915 for Sarcoma UK – 332% of the initial target.

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MFT and Medtronic partner to accelerate MedTech innovations across the NHS

Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust (MFT) has strengthened its partnership with medical technology company, Medtronic, with an agreement to co-develop new health technology solutions with a focus on robotic surgery and artificial intelligence (AI).

The two organisations have signed a UK-first RDI (Research, Development and Innovation) collaboration agreement that will streamline the collaboration process on mutually beneficial research and innovation projects in four main areas: cardiovascular, neuroscience, medical surgery and diabetes.

Atelerix, a biotech company revolutionising cell preservation and biological transport with its pioneering hydrogel encapsulation technology, today announced it has entered into a new distribution agreement with CliniSciences, a leading European player in the distribution and development of solutions for research and diagnostics. Expanding on Atelerix's global operational scale-up^{1,2}, the large territory, non-exclusive distribution agreement marks the Company's continued success in addressing the growing demand for its suite of non-cryogenic cell preservation solutions, as well as enabling penetration into the rapidly growing North African life sciences market.

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Bouygues Energies & Services shortlisted for Made in Scotland Awards

Bouygues' Valneva Advanced Vaccine Manufacturing Facility in Livingston demonstrates how Scotland is leading in advanced life sciences manufacturing. Delivered ahead of schedule and under budget, the facility enables rapid, scalable, and sustainable production of vaccines, strengthening the UK's response to global health challenges.

By using a digital-first, modular approach—including a digital twin and offsite fabrication—we compressed delivery time while maintaining GMP standards. The project also creates high-value jobs, develops future talent through apprenticeships, and integrates sustainable design, reducing operational energy by 30%.

Victoria House officially launches as London's new centre for life sciences

Victoria House, a newly restored Grade II listed building in London's Bloomsbury Square, officially opened its doors on 16 September as a state-of-the-art life sciences hub.

Developed by Oxford Properties and Pioneer Group, converted by CW Architects and delivered by contractor Wates, the 300,000 sq ft facility redefines the capital's science and technology landscape. The building offers a unique combination of lab-enabled, fully fitted and incubator laboratory space and serviced offices within highly technical, tailored infrastructure – supporting the full lifecycle of life sciences companies as well as multinational pharmaceutical and biotechnology businesses, academic research institutions, government agencies, and venture capital firms.

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Medicines Discovery Catapult and Crown Bioscience Form Strategic Global Alliance for Radiopharmaceutical Innovation

Medicines Discovery Catapult (MDC) and Crown Bioscience have formed a strategic global collaboration to deliver an integrated translational biology platform for innovators developing radiopharmaceuticals.

Radiopharmaceuticals are a growing class of medicines that contain radioactive forms of chemical elements (called radioisotopes) that effectively diagnose and treat cancers. They provide a rapidly advancing approach to the future of medical research and treatments, with the potential to drive game-changing breakthroughs for patients.

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Invitation to collaborate: Mast cell platform for allergy research and drug screening

The University of Manchester are excited to explore a unique collaboration opportunity with their team, focused on advancing mast cell-based allergy research and drug discovery.

About the platform

Mast cells are central to allergic responses, but because they reside in tissues, obtaining them directly from patients is challenging. Commonly used mast cell lines fail to capture the full functionality of primary mast cells and must be used with caution.

To address this limitation, we have optimised a robust method for generating primary mast cells from human progenitor cells. In collaboration with NHS Blood and Transplant, we've established an efficient pipeline that allows us to produce these cells in large quantities. Our progenitor-derived mast cells form an almost pure population that remains stable in culture for over a year—offering both biological relevance and consistency for day-to-day experimental use.

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Pioneer and AbbVie team up on a Golden Ticket to accelerate game-changing innovations in human health

Pioneer Group, a specialist in life science infrastructure and venture building, has once again teamed up with global biopharmaceutical company AbbVie to launch a Golden Ticket programme designed to accelerate companies developing novel, transformational therapies and innovations for immunology, oncology, neurology, eye care, aesthetics, or other specialities including obesity, GI and hepatology.

The 2025 Golden Ticket Programme offers the opportunity for an early-stage biotech company to secure one year of funding for lab space, a £50,000 grant, mentorship and scientific expertise to support its growth and development.

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£22 million NIHR investment to strengthen UK health and life sciences innovation

Newcastle University has been awarded £22M by the National Institute for Health and Care Research to continue research identifying emerging medicines, diagnostics, devices and digital technologies.

These have the potential to transform care, reduce inequalities and support a more responsive and resilient system.

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Breakthrough Glioblastoma Treatments Move Closer to Patients as Medicines Discovery Catapult and King's College London Secure Brain Tumour Charity Funding

Medicines Discovery Catapult (MDC) and King's College London (KCL) have been awarded £400k funding from The Brain Tumour Charity to develop a groundbreaking new approach to treat glioblastoma, for patient benefit.

Glioblastomas are the most common form of brain cancer and are highly aggressive, with poor survival outcomes. Patients survive on average for just 12-18 months after diagnosis, with only one-third of patients surviving for a year or more. Despite decades of intensive research and a greater understanding of glioblastoma tumour biology, there are still limited effective treatment options.

Spearheaded by KCL and MDC, the project will bring together proprietary technologies to offer a new route to deliver drugs safely and effectively into brain tumours.

This team included Kimberly Louise Rockley who won the Bionow Rising Star Award in 2022 for her work in this field.

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Northern Engineering Solutions Supports Trailblazing Project In Sustainable Industrial Chemistry

Northern Engineering Solutions is currently supporting the groundbreaking work of C3 Biotech - a spinout from Manchester Institute of Biotechnology (MIB) that is redefining how commodity chemicals and fuels are produced using generative biology and non-sterile fermentation.

The process engineering company based in North Shields recently designed, built, delivered and installed the first bespoke 1000L fermenter at a facility in Manchester. The fermenter forms part of C3's proprietary innovation to enable the transition toward bio-derived chemicals at an industrial scale, and it is already showing promising results.

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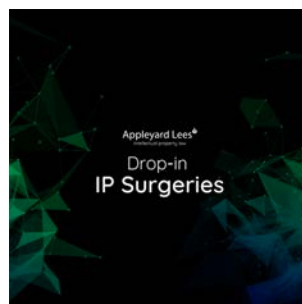
